

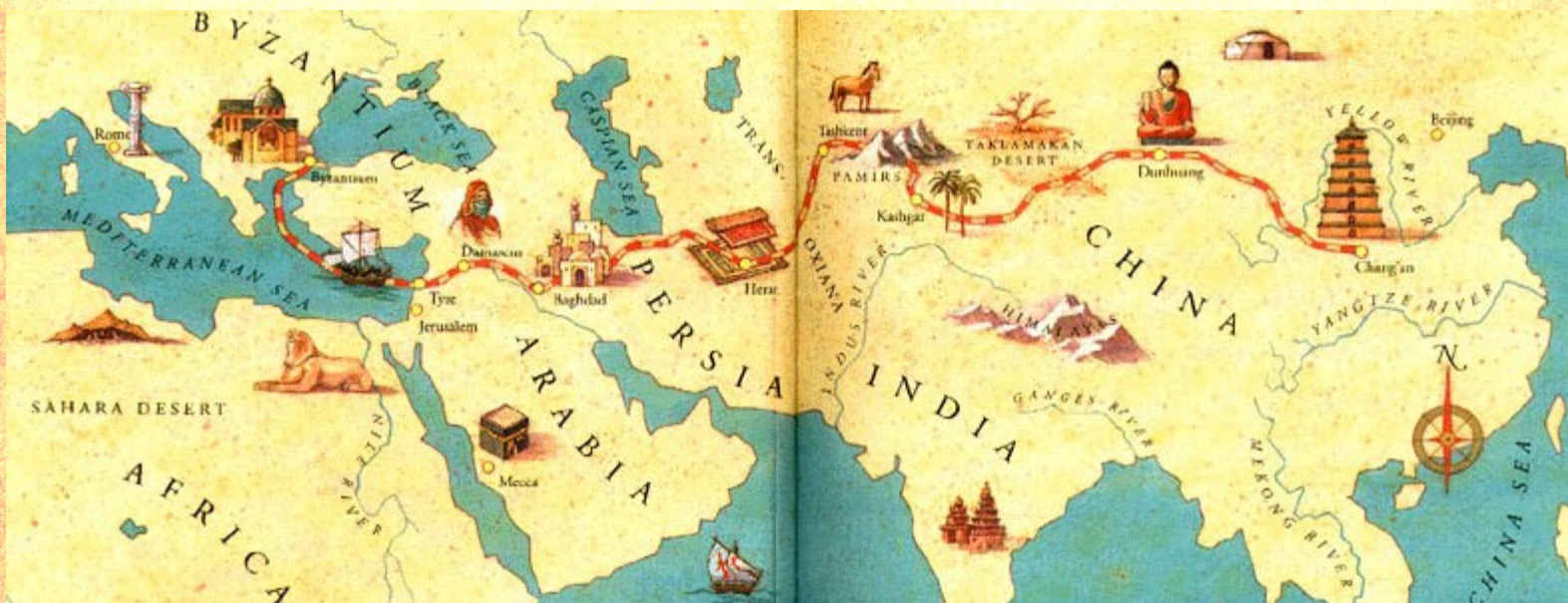
# Silk Road, Past and Present

Throughout history, communication routes and paths of trade have linked East and West, along which goods, knowledge, ideas, cultures and beliefs were, and continue to be, exchanged. In this day-long workshop, we will explore the ancient trading routes of the Silk Road and their legacies.



- ◆ Learn about trade and cultural exchange by examining the ancient Silk Roads as well as contemporary trading patterns between East and West.
- ◆ Make connections between two important world regions (Asia and the Greater Middle East) & earn CEUS.
- ◆ Look at art objects from countries along the Silk Road in a visit to the Ackland Art Museum.
- ◆ Gain a new perspective on teaching about the Silk Road via exposure to visual art and music.
